III. MAT Program:

- A. Jail was closed for a period of time due to COVID-19 but is now open.
 - 1. Program changes due to shut down- Lab work and urine samples are done at the jail and brought to a lab (reducing pt contact with hospitals).
 - 2. Injections are still being done within the jail.
- B. 21 open MAT cases, 1 pending NNAI
- C. Referrals lowered therefore, trying to utilize PR.
- D. Referrals will be followed up within 24/hr on a business day.

IV. Other information presented:

- A. More people are on Suboxone than vivitrol.
- B. Illegal sales of Suboxone have been seen.
- C. Illicit sales of Gabapentin.

V. ED2Recovery Grant (Satori House):

- A. Peer coaches available 24/7 for drug use response in Sauk and Columbia County. Currently they have 3 coaches and are looking for one more. Their goal is to break down treatment barriers.
