PARCC Meeting Minutes Tuesday, January 28, 2020 1:00pm - 3:00pm District Office -Board Room

1. Recognition

- a. Chief Manthey is retiring, he will be missed! He has been an important member of our group for the last 5 years. PARCC is donating \$250 to the Ballistic Shield initiative.
- b. Lindsay Patterson has been with us for the last two years and she is moving on to a job at Sauk County Public Health. Tomorrow is Lindsay's last day and she will be missed! Good luck to Lindsay!

2. Data Discussion

- a. We split into groups at our December meeting to review several different data sets and we are going to continue to look at our top areas of concern today.
- b. Tobacco/Vaping
 - i. 2 teen court cases
 - ii. 4 sales to minors (WI WINS checks) All IDs were checked and still sold
 - iii. Lodi 3 underage citations
 - iv. Poynette 1 underage citation
 - v. Columbus 4 underage citations
 - vi. Portage 39 underage citations (28 tobacco possession/7 on school grounds/4 furnishing tobacco to minors.)
 - vii. County 6 underage citations
 - viii. YRBS: 30 day use 10% MS Students & 21% HS students
 - 1. Explosion in vaping
 - 2. Odorless, hard to detect
 - 3. Easily accessible
 - 4. Increase in 8th grade (1:5)
 - 5. HS doubled between 10th and 11th grades
 - 6. Half of the people have tried vaping at the HS level
 - 7. No gender difference

c. Marijuana

- i. Starting before the age of 13 showed an increase(?)
- ii. Higher rates in students with trauma/abuse in their history
- iii. Higher numbers in students with special needs
- iv. A high percent that have tried it, but less use in the last 30 day data.
- v. Mostly using outside of school
- vi. Poor, minority also high
- vii. 11% at the HS level: 5% at the MS level
- viii. Same use in males and females
- ix. Lodi 26 possession citations, 6 criminal arrests (2 juvenile/24 adult)
- x. Poynette 23 possession citations
- xi. Columbus 32 THC/paraphernalia citations
- xii. County 70 citations for THC possession (ordinance citations, not criminal)

xiii. YRBS Data: 30 day use: MS = 4% and HS = 15%

d. Alcohol

- i. 40% of 12th graders experimenting with alcohol, 18% of 8th graders
- ii. Hispanic youth were starting to drink earlier than other populations
- iii. Higher rate of use for females than males
- iv. Lower grades for those reporting drinking
- v. Students who feel like they don't belong and kids who are experiencing food insecurity had higher rates of use.
- vi. Kids no longer receiving special ed services had slightly higher rates of use.
- vii. Compliance checks: 13 sales to minors (IDs checked in 11 of the sales)
- viii. Portage 14 underage drinking
- ix. County 56 underage drinking
- x. Poynette 2 underage drinking
- xi. Columbus 3 underage drinking
- xii. YRBS: 13% of MS students and 31% of HS students
- xiii. OWI Concerns:
 - 1. Lodi 20 (13 for alcohol)
 - 2. Poynette 43
 - 3. Columbus 43
 - 4. Portage 91
 - 5. County 259

e. Opioid Data

- i. MS kids tried something other than marijuana:
 - 1. 2% of HS students tried opiates
 - 2. 2% of students have tried meth
 - 3. No data for 9th or 10th graders
 - 4. More female use than male use
 - 5. 7% in hispanic population
 - 6. Lodi 4 ODs (2 fatal)
 - 7. Poynette 1 OD
 - 8. Columbus 2 ODs (no fatal)
 - 9. Porage 24 OD (2 fatal)
 - 10. County 33 ODs (6 fatal)
 - 11. YRBS Data: Have misused an over the counter or prescription pain medication: 9% at MS and 12% at HS.

3. <u>Drug Endangered Children (DEC) Presentation (Dr. Jill)</u>

- a. Goal is to reduce the number of children that are exposed to drugs/drug related situations.
- b. Schools, parents, community leaders, medical staff, law enforcement and DA office partnership
- c. We want to expand/continue the work of this group. Focus is on prevention!
- d. Handle with Care protocol with police (Does this happen at the county and local levels?)
- e. Mandatory reporting, making sure we are identifying drug endangered children and reporting it to law enforcement.
- f. Charges related to both drugs and neglect via the DAs office.
- g. Cheat sheet for mandatory reporting is being developed by the DEC group.
- h. Goal is to put the kids first!
- i. Department of Justice has adopted DEC in WI.
- j. National DEC website would have more information.
- k. Could DEC become a sub-committee of the PARCC group? The Executive Committee is supportive of this idea moving forward.
- I. Committee meetings will need to happen outside of the regular monthly PARCC meeting and then reports can be made to the whole group.

4. Tobacco Prevention and Control Program Grant

a. Dane County Prevention group is just Dane County, Columbia County is no longer included in this project, which is why we need to apply for a grant specifically for Columbia County.

5. Opioid Grant

- a. We are also planning to write a grant related to an opioid strategy.
- b. Innovative approaches and practices would be the strategy we would focus on.
- c. Ideas for areas to focus on:
 - i. Health literacy (How to read a prescription bottle etc.)
 - ii. Trauma informed care focus on schools
 - iii. Narcan Available in school districts
- d. "Live It" Evidence based program offered by Prairie Ridge Hospital.
 - i. Chronic disease
 - ii. Pain medication
 - iii. Prescription opioid use

6. <u>Updates</u>

- a. Tom Drury Taken away pre-authorizations for drug assisted treatment. This is a huge change and improvement for individuals who need medication assisted treatment.
 - i. A team of people presented on resources available in the county for folks dealing with mental health or substance abuse issues.
- b. Lindsay Patterson Shared information regarding the new "Tobacco 21" legislation.
 - i. Tobacco 21 is the law of the land, it was passed federally.
 - ii. There is not a grandfather law nor an exemption for military personnel.
 - iii. There is no requirement from the federal level to update state laws, so that state laws have to match the federal law.
 - iv. Can we get a draft of an advocacy type note that we can send to our legislators?
- c. Chief Manthey Thanks to Jake at Sitori house for all of his great work!
- Jake Niesen Will be a trainer for administering Narcan, he has 700+ doses. Sitori House Recovery Incorporated, which will be recovery coaching for both Columbia and Sauk counties.
 - i. Send Jake and email if you, or your organization, needs Narcan.

- ii. How can we get Narcan into Kwik Trips and McDonalds etc.? Often overdoses happen in these locations.
- e. Nancy Long Congratulations to graduates of the drug treatment court!
- f. MAT Updates
 - i. Shared data from the MAT program
- g. Daniel Ruland Alliance for WI Youth Coalition members and youth both attend CADCA event together. Goal is for it to be a fun experience for students, so that students have ideas to take back to their schools.
- h. Heather Woods Clean Slate in Madison. Another resource for MAT, they have same day appointments and walk-in appointments. They treat opioid and alcohol addictions.
- i. Monica Neumann Drug court coordinator, last night 2 drug court graduates were celebrated. Great turnout, both participants have been clean for 3 years!
