1. Minutes from last meeting approved; Mission & Vision Statement discussion tabled for next meeting
2. Robin West – Family Health LaClinica
 - a. LCSW - She specializes in trauma counseling & AODA counseling. LaClinica has funds available (for roughly the next 6 months) to provide services for individuals without insurance that need these services; also have MAT program available at their facility; recently certified for QPR, and looking for more opportunities to facilitate this.
3. Introductions & Updates from the group
 - a. Lindsay Patterson - staff will be working to hand out lock boxes at the Drug Take Back events on April 28th - Paula in Columbus, Lindsay in Lodi - (thank you Stacy for volunteering to help in Portage); looking for a few more participants to attend the countywide YRBS Data Summit; we attempted to host the first Columbia County youth night in Portage on March 20th, but had terrible turnout...we will be trying again on April 23rd in Lodi, and are open to suggestions for recruiting youth!
 - b. Ken Manthey - introduced Mike Dittman to the group; Pete Warning has been utilizing his DRE training, which has been very helpful to them so far.
 - c. Sara Shaver - from Compass Counseling, this is her first meeting (welcome!); has been working with Stacy on Project HOPE - services free to family members, covered by grant funds - it's a pilot program, but hoping to have something run continuously in the future; 10 member limit; talking about what addiction looks like & how it affects the family members...also what resources are available, self-care, etc. to family members.

- d. Todd Hepler - treatment court is continuing to do well; 7 participants & about half have moved on from phase 1 of the program; will be handling his own terminations, if it comes down to that.
- e. Shannon Wojciechowski - from probation & parole, this is her first meeting (welcome!); looking for a contact for the Handle with Care program/looking to help treat those individuals.
- f. Sam Sonnenberg - citizen/drug court participant, first meeting (welcome!); curious if anything is going on with intensive counseling/outpatient in Col. Co.? Stacy mentioned that the Pauquette Center is trying to do so & HHS will be providing referrals/it's a work in progress...Connie (speaking for Tellurian) spoke regarding finishing setting up Baraboo's program before they'll be expanding services to other counties.
- g. Deb Steele - citizen/Poynette community member, Sam's mother, first meeting (welcome!); she is planning to sign up for Project HOPE; mentioned she works for a pharmaceutical company in Dane Co. & wanting to help find a solution to this epidemic.
- h. Cindy LeGrand - from River Haven; things are evolving, but she needs to know more about different agencies to direct individuals to & needs more info on wrap-around services in Col. Co.; recently involved in drug court; currently full at the family shelter.
- i. Roxanne Grossbier - from Renewal Unlimited Inc.; works with housing & the homeless population along with Cindy.
- j. Scott Klicko - spoke to YRBS data concerns in Lodi; having a busy year at Lodi PD with youth at the HS level; seems like it's almost coming in a full circle with the substances they're seeing youth using.
- k. Deanna Lord - attended an education conference where speaker talked about opioids & progression in healthcare; WAPA is getting the presentation from this gentleman to bring to Col. Co. communities.
- l. Darrel Kuhl - continuing presentations throughout the community - seeing a lot more requests from businesses & info on what to look for; continuing the program in Pardeeville schools - going well with positive feedback from students; heads up - change coming (~2021) from the state level back to the counties for youth in jails...Col. Co. will need to come up with a rehabilitation program to help these youth sentenced through the county courts.
- m. Meghan Blader - cases are not slowing down; documenting all drug cases (est. 40%), but trying to track those better; will be having staff changing over in the next few months, as they always feel like they're short-handed.
- n. Diana Karls - reiterated the importance of people being at the table for the County Data Summit.
- o. Robin West - reaching out to police & corrections, wants to welcome anyone with trauma to counseling services.

- p. Lieah Wilder - reinforced Robin's message - everybody welcome at their clinic (10 county service area); a recovery center will be opening in Adams later this year, which will also be open to Col. Co. residents (federally funded clinic).
 - q. Susan Lorenz - reminder there are programs serving pregnant mothers from lower income (Nurse Family Partnership - first time moms); other programs available to other moms as well - including ~1,000 in Col. Co. through WIC.
 - r. Sue Bradley - president of Col. Co. CASA - works with kids coming through the courts (volunteers); looking for more funding.
 - s. Dennis Radloff - DHS; Dept of Care & Services - accepting proposals for new grant funding for Addiction Medicine Consultation Program; should be launching ~May 1st, but not completely up & running right at that time; they are not anticipating a large number of submissions, but at least a few; funding is unique to WI, specifically for clinical teams; should have more info & updates at the next meeting!
 - t. Stacy Davenport - update handout passed out (attached); would like to bring lock boxes/bags to PARCC meetings, while supplies last; presentation with River Haven had successful impact on housing for women, thanks in part to the article in the paper; has applied for a grant to expand the MAT program - waiting to hear, but has received a phone call from DHS assured that they will receive at least 1 more year of funding!
 - u. Emily Dilley - continuing project CLEAN - going into MS & HS to present to students & providing "charge banks"; starting a community education task force (Columbus/Col. Co. still figuring this out) - working with Spectrum on "shock & awe" messaging & social media campaign...once these are finished, will ask everyone to push them out (to 12 & older); looking to link countywide resources on their hospital website, so please send info her way!
 - v. Ryan Sheahan - tobacco compliance checks will be starting again soon (May/June); First Breath is revamping their programming this year, expanding to those using tobacco in the home with pregnant women.
 - w. Troy Cross - have been 3 weeks without a coordinator on the Drunk Driving Court...searching for a new coordinator & any good referrals are welcome!
 - x. Josh Champion - Crisis House in Pardeeville; in need of substance abuse sober living housing - also looking at a female apartment to be provided down the road.
 - y. Connie Champion - now with Tellurian (congrats!), passed out shorter stats handout; working on creating better language around data gathering - concern with using term "completed," since it's a lifelong process; looking at improving services & then expanding those services.
 - z. Tom Drury - spoke to being moved by what was shared at the courthouse regarding where Col. Co. has come; thank you to the group on behalf of parents!
