- 1. Minutes from last meeting approved; Approval of revised Mission & Vision statements
- 2. Introductions & Updates from the group
  - a. Tom first: from last meeting, go back to Co & gave update; Tom attended county finance meeting, asked to attend full board meeting Stacy presented very nice update, Tom followed with thanking them for their support & cooperation with PARCC initiatives, and also gave overview of Drug Treatment Court; county board pleased with both presentations...second: Prevent Suicide meeting, discussion of booth at Col Co Fair & Tom asked if PARCC could share a booth July 25-29, email will go out for volunteers to be at booth (for a couple hours per day). Paula will need to figure out what this looks like, what hours would be that people need to be at booth, etc; Paula will contact Prevent Suicide & send out further information to the group.
  - b. Aria evaluator for MAT/MATRS grant, looking at what makes program successful; bringing evaluation to community key stakeholders – looking to do Key Stakeholder Interviews & Community Survey, this is the first round of surveys; if interested in doing an interview, completely voluntary & can contact Aria to set up a time that works with your schedule.
  - c. Devin set up tracking system for lock boxes/bags/Deterra for Portage & Lodi pharmacies: filling out how & why they got it, first name & 1 piece of info for follow-up purposes; people very receptive so far that have taken items identified individuals for opiates/benzo prescriptions for these so far; 4-5 vivitrol injections so far in June, so this is gaining traction; OneOme/Pharmacoaching cheek swab, lets patients know how their body is metabolizing the Rxs they're on & if there are better options, used for a wide variety of disease meds covered 100% by Medicaid, partially by some insurances.
  - d. Clint moved to new building; Drug Court coordinator taking job with the state, so will have change in that position.

- e. Amanda Attorney Troy Cross elected judge; August 18<sup>th</sup> County having Open House party, with potential speakers from DNR, Mayor, Governor tours of all the buildings, more info to come.
- f. Tawsif Right to Try legislation passed, example of bipartisan work; 14 pieces of legislation recently introduced in Sen. Johnson's committee more info to come; report out June 20<sup>th</sup> regarding Medicare & Medicaid re: better policing of where dollars are actually going/fraud & waste passed around report for group to look over & send any thoughts to Sen. Johnson's office; committee hearing coming up to discuss logistics/accountability of this report; mobile office hours had 23 people show up & also Sen. Johnson did Town Hall Meeting regarding the family separation controversy in the news lately.
- g. Josh has 1 open spot at Sober Living House in Pardeeville; cycling people through, doing their best to help these individuals; stays vary from person to person, but generally short-term stays are overnight & longest close to 4 months.
- h. Connie lots of changes at Tellurian, Chloe & Erin no longer in Col Co; Connie covering some of their workload; adjusting funding sources Tellurian will just be providing services in Col Co; Day Treatment in Baraboo also takes Col Co residents looking to split it up to women's & men's clinics; positions posted on Indeed currently wanting substance use background specifically vs just mental health looking for someone who is dual-licensed.
- i. Dawn HHS moved into new building, which is very exciting minus minor issues, but more accessible to populations they serve; trying to get 3 LTE positions approved through county to take on MATRS program took to finance committee last week; working on 2019 Budget requesting 2 more positions for children impacted by opiate abuse issues, but have no budget increase for 2019; WI Act 262 changed qualification requirements for substance abuse counselors in WI, but this is still getting sorted out as Medicaid hasn't changed their expectations other states didn't have as strict regulations (extra credentials), so this was limiting number of providers in WI. Lots of questions from group Connie added that this is still getting figured out at the credentialing office in Madison & may take a couple of years to finalize this change process.
- j. Stacy spoke at county board & gave a brief overview (they had 7 new members) of MATRS program, was nice to have Tom & the judge there to add additional information; Erin moved to La Clinica & Chloe moved to prison system so CHHS working to figure out referrals, etc. Stacy also recently presented to CCS providers; ended contract with Tellurian, so crisis number will be changing & beginning July 1<sup>st</sup>, Sauk Co will warm transfer Col Co residents met with Northwest staff to train on fielding these calls.
- k. Shannon R Sober Apt a block away from Season's Building; 2-way check-in, not left out completely on an island; have hired new female therapeutic mentor & new male mentor; Thursdays at 5pm free support group at Season's Building; near future plans looking to expand for more apartment options coming open to provide female sober living & still potentially looking for a prescriber. Connie

- added women's sober living housing in Baraboo closing soon, so a big loss for female clientele.
- I. Shannon W Dept of Corrections piloting new program to allow agents in community to provide Narcan: Col Co not a pilot site, but if staff attends training/provided Narcan they can use it, but hopefully in 2 years all sites will be set up & supported by DOC...very preliminary stages. Scott added important to encourage staff to do training for their own safety/protection. Connie suggested contacting Sauk Co PH for free training, as they have grant funds for these types of trainings; Stacy also met recently with ARCW rep & can potentially set up training in Col Co. Paula filling out grant that can support Narcan training & buying Narcan will be available in the fall.
- m. Scott school safety grant money from state: have not received anything in Lodi yet; staffing has affected Lodi PD, with 3 new officers Drug Court participants affected with change in team as well what will we do to adjust if this is the trend? Scott thinks the drug use trend may show an uptick due to this as well.
- n. Tiffany wrote 1 year grant for mental health: goal to eliminate barriers to access to mental health resources for students; looking at mental wellness & universal screening for social-emotional health to catch younger students, etc; thankful that county was willing to partner with Lodi Schools on this, and amazed at how much better services kids get through Medicaid vs private insurance.
- o. Paula working on a few prevention grants right now: PFS grant (\$50,000) due mid-July, for education/lock boxes/DRE training, etc; moving forward rather than training more DREs, will use funds to get supplies; providing prescriber education dollars how can we move forward with this? Stacy said good timing for this now, as a lot of prescribers need training hours right now potentially lunch & learn event.
- 3. Next Meeting: Proposed to skip July meeting agreed upon by group in attendance; next meeting will be August 28, 2018 in Portage Roger Brandner will be at the next meeting to provide information on OD Mapping & Handle with Care action teams.
